## UNAPPROVED MINUTES

In July, LCVS Veteran Assistance Programs (VAP) provided a grand total of \$17,189.58 in relief funds. VAP relief funds were provided for Burial Benefits (\$12,000), housing relief/ emergent shelter (\$4,373.14), child clothing vouchers (\$594.30) and Gleaners/Walmart food assistance (\$222.14).

In July, LCVS Transportation provided 158 rides to medical appointments which is a value of \$5,537.15 or \$35.05 per veteran ride provided. Our replacement transit has arrived and in operation. Also, we have 2 volunteer drivers who completed training last Friday (August 16) and are available to cover on an as-needed basis. As a result, we are now able to maintain operations with 2 daily routes.
