## Resolution to Conditionally Approve the FY 2023-2025 Multi Year Plan of the Area Agency on Aging 1-B - Board of Commissioners

- **WHEREAS**, the Area Agency on Aging 1-B has been supporting services to Livingston County residents since 1974; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Area Agency on Aging 1-B has assessed the needs of older county residents and developed a plan to provide assistance that addresses identified needs; and
- **WHEREAS**, the proposed plan has been submitted for review by the public, and has been subjected to a public hearing; and
- **WHEREAS**, the comments at the public hearings on the proposed plan were mostly favorable, and constructive changes in the plan were made as a result of some comments; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Michigan Bureau of Aging and Community Living Supports requires that county Boards of Commissioners be given the opportunity to review an area agency on aging's annual implementation plan; and
- WHEREAS, last year on July 12, 2021, the Livingston County Board of Commissioners unanimously approved Resolution 2021-07-103, a Resolution Approving the FY 2022 Annual Implementation Plan of the Area Agency on Aging 1-B; and
- WHEREAS, The Livingston County Board of Commissioners approved the FY 2022 Annual Implementation Plan of the Area Agency on Aging 1-B "with the understanding that elements of Critical Race Theory are not included in any of their training programs"; and
- WHEREAS, the FY2023-2025 plan under consideration contains mandates from the State of Michigan requiring AAA-1B provide differing levels of service based upon skin color and sexual orientation. Furthermore, additional State mandates exacerbate racial division by requiring Diversity Equity and Inclusion training and Implicit Bias Training; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Livingston County Board of Commissioners opposes State mandates requiring differing quality of elder care based upon skin color and sexual orientation; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Livingston County Board of Commissioners opposes State mandates requiring AAA-1B staff to be indoctrinated with racially divisive concepts; and
- **WHEREAS**, fulfilling these State mandates necessarily diverts precious resources from delivering the highest level of care possible to those in need.
- **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Livingston County Board of Commissioners hereby urges the revocation of discriminatory State mandates such that Livingston County citizens are provided with optimum elder-care, and approves the FY 2023-2025 Multi Year Plan of the Area Agency on Aging 1-B once these discriminatory elements are removed.
