## **Resolution Establishing Limitations to State and/or Local Government Emergency Measures Emanating from the Livingston County Health Department Regarding a Pandemic – Board of Commissioners**

**WHEREAS,** the members of the Livingston County Board of Commissioners have solemnly sworn an oath to uphold the Constitution of the United States, which was established to “promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity;” and

**WHEREAS,** the Livingston County Board of Commissioners now recognizes that government-driven countermeasures to the Covid-19 pandemic have had significant adverse effects on the general welfare of residents, for example, by the closures and dissolution of small businesses, by the record inflation and economic devastation we are experiencing across our state, and by the deterioration of mental health among our young people; and

**WHEREAS,** the Livingston County Board of Commissioners now recognizes that during the Covid-19 pandemic, the blessings of liberty for our citizens were pummeled by government through unconstitutional, extended lockdowns, mandates, and executive orders; and

**WHEREAS,** the Livingston County Board of Commissioners vows to uphold our oaths to protect all rights and freedoms of our citizens as enumerated in the Constitution of the United States, including during a pandemic, epidemic, or other emergency situation; and

**WHEREAS,** these Constitutional rights include, but are not limited to, protecting the sacred, inalienable human and legal rights of our citizens to enjoy the freedom of assembly, freedom of speech, the right to medical privacy, and the right to make autonomous decisions regarding one’s own health care and the healthcare of his or her children in accordance with the medical ethics principle of informed consent, including in the context of a private doctor-patient relationship unthreatened by censorship or any government control; and

**WHEREAS,** the United States is a nation of people with God given rights and government is the servant to protect the rights and people, said form government has many checks and balances on the unelected and elected servants yet the Michigan Health Code, rules and regulations are replete with no checks, no balances, no appeal-processes and no due process, such that the servants can abuse their employers.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Livingston County Board of Commissioners strongly **recommends changes such as** all state or local government emergency measures affecting or emanating from the Livingston County Health Department (LCHD) regarding a pandemic or epidemic shall expire after 28 calendar days (at 12:01am on the 29<sup>th</sup> day), and after expiration, only a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the full Board of Commissioners shall authorize a continuation of emergency measures, limited to a month-by-month basis.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that, since the following would be repugnant to the Constitution of the United States, the Livingston County Board of Commissioners strongly recommends that the Livingston County Health Department (LCHD) not impose, permit, or enforce vaccine mandates, mask mandates, mandate testing of asymptomatic persons, mandate a “vaccine passport” type system, or assist in administrating the quarantining of healthy, asymptomatic individuals, recognizing that it is unlawful to force quarantine on any healthy resident without a judicial remedy in a court of law.
